

## DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

### Tiger Point System (TPS)

<b>6+ Tardies</b>	5 points for each tardy of six or more
<b>Defacing School Property/Vandalism</b>	5 – 10 points
<b>Leaving Class Without Permission</b>	10 points
<b>Unverified Late Arrival</b>	10 – 25 pts at the discretion of the Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students
<b>Class Cut</b>	20 points
<b>Unauthorized Leaving School Grounds</b>	20 points
<b>Truancy</b>	25 points
<b>Insubordination</b>	5 – 25 points at the discretion of the Vice Principal or Supervisor of Services
<b>Disrespectful Behavior</b>	5 – 25 points at the discretion of the Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students
<b>Profanity/Obscene Language</b>	5 – 25 points at the discretion of the Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students

The following procedures and consequences will be invoked per the discretion of the Vice Principal and/or Supervisor of Students. (Points accumulate on a semester basis or at the discretion of the Vice Principal and/or Supervisor of Students.)

<b>5 points</b>	Parent/Guardian notified, 1 Central Detention
<b>10 points</b>	Parent/Guardian notified, 2 Central Detentions
<b>15 points</b>	Parent/Guardian notified, 2 Central Detentions, Revocation of IDT privilege (assignment to Study Hall and/or Closed Campus)
<b>20 points</b>	Parent/Guardian notified, 3 Central Detentions, Revocation of IDT privilege (assignment to Study Hall and/or Closed Campus), Review/Revocation of Student Privileges and Eligibility for School Activities
<b>25 points</b>	Parent/Guardian notified, 4 Central Detentions, Revocation of IDT privilege (assignment to Study Hall and/or Closed Campus), Review/Revocation of Student Privileges and Eligibility for School Activities
<b>30+ points</b>	Student Services Group (S.S.G.) convened to develop action plan and Principal or Vice Principal meeting/consequences.

In lieu of and/or in addition to detention, learning packets related to the disciplinary issue may be assigned at the discretion of the Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students.

Students have an opportunity to request to have their points reduced in increments of five for every 21 school days without any disciplinary infractions. The Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students will contact the student's teachers, counselors, and case manager (if applicable) to verify student's status. The Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students has the final determination whether or not to reduce points. Students also have the opportunity to develop and propose their own point-reduction plan (such as school/community service projects, etc.) to the Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students. The Vice Principal or Supervisor of Students must approve the proposal.
